It was first adopted by the 2nd General Assembly of the World Medical Association, Geneva, Switzerland, September 1948. It was then amended by the 22nd World Medical Assembly, Sydney, Australia, August 1968; and then again by the 35th World Medical Assembly, Venice, Italy, October 1983 and then at the 46th WMA General Assembly, Stockholm, Sweden, September 1994 and editorially revised by the 170th WMA Council Session, Divonne-les-Bains, France, May 2005 and the 173rd WMA Council Session, Divonne-les-Bains, France, May 2006.
